Ukraine deeply values the solidarity demonstrated by your country and its leadership at this most challenging period.

As the winter period progresses, the Russian Federation continues to conduct intensive air attacks against Ukraine's civilian population and critical infrastructure, particularly energy generation, heating, and water supply facilities. These attacks are deliberately designed to deprive civilians of basic services during the cold season and to create a large-scale humanitarian crisis leaving millions of people without light and heat in cold winter season. They not only cause damage to the infrastructure, but are destructive of the daily reality of millions of civilians – families, children, elderly people – facing winter conditions without electricity, heating, or water. Under such circumstances, air defence becomes not only a military necessity, but a humanitarian imperative.

The delivery of air defense AMRAAM missiles AIM-9X, AIM-120, Patriot PAC3 and air-to-air AIM-9M, AIM-9L helped us to minimize the consequences.

In this context, I would respectfully request your kind assistance in raising this urgent matter with the Minister of Defence and the Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of your country, with a view to exploring the possibility of transferring air-defence and air-to-air missiles, in particular missiles of the AIM family, to Ukraine.
